Anointing χρῖσμα *chrisma*

anointing ... 1J 2:20, 27. Usually taken to mean anointing with the Holy Spirit.

Antichrist ἀντίχριστος *antichristos*

Adversary of the Messiah, to appear in the last days ... 1J 2:18, 22; 4:3.

To be ashamed αἰσχύνομαι *aischunomai*, middle voice of αἰσχύνω *aischunô*To experience shame, be put to shame, be disgraced ... be disappointed in a hope ... before someone 1J 2:28

Confess ὁμολογέω homologeô

To acknowledge someth., ordinarily in public, acknowledge, claim, profess, praise... Profession of allegiance... Especially of confessing Christ, or the teaching of his community.

Confidence παρρησία parrésia

A state of boldness and confidence, courage, confidence, boldness, fearlessness, especially in the presence of persons of high rank... 1J 2:28

To deceive πλανάω planaô

To cause to go astray from a specific way, action... Lead astray ... cause someone to wander from the right way... To mislead, deceive ... 1J.

To deny ἀρνέομαι *arneomai*

To disclaim association with a pers. or event, deny, repudiate, disown (verbally or nonverbally)... Repudiating Christ ... 1J 2:23.

Holy One ἄγιος hagios

Originally ... the quality possessed by things and persons that could approach a divinity. ... being dedicated or consecrated to the service of God. ... Used as a pure substantive, the holy (thing, person) ... God ... 1J 2:20.

Hour ὥρα *ôra*

A point of time as an occasion for an event, time... The present age of the world's existence 1J 2:18.

Last ἔσχατος *eschatos*

The final item in a series, least, last in time \dots a situation in which there is nothing to follow \dots 1J 2:18

Promise ἐπαγγελία epaggelia

Το promise ἐπαγγέλλομαι *epaggellomai*

Declaration (to declare) to do something with implication of obligation to carry out what is stated, promise, pledge, offer.
