be born γεννάω gennaô

1 become the parent of, beget

b by exercising the role of a parental figure ... Passive [to be born from God] ... 1J 2:29; 3:9; 4:7; 5:1, 4, 18.

make manifest φανερόω phaneroô

2 to cause to become known, disclose, show, make known

b β passive with intransitive ... become public knowledge, be disclosed, become known J 3:21 ... 1J 4:9.

only μονογενής monogenés

2 being the only one of its kind or class, *unique* (in kind) of something that is the only example of its category ... [only Son] is used only of Jesus. The renderings *only*, *unique* may be quite adequate for all its occurrences ... 1J 4:9.

propitiation ίλασμός hilasmos

1 appeasement necessitated by sin, *expiation*... Of Jesus as the [propitiation for our sins] 1J 2:2; 4:10. But meaning 2 has been popular.

2 instrument for appeasing, sacrifice to atone, sin-offering.
