Year 1 (AD 27-28)

- J. Jesus teaches in synagogues across Galilee, including Nazareth (Matthew 4:13-16, Mark 6:1-6).

Year 3 (AD 29-30)

- K. Jesus begins to focus more on his journey to Jerusalem, teaching and healing along the way (Luke 9:51-56).
- L. Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead in Bethany (John 11:1-44).
- M. Jesus is anointed by Mary of Bethany and prepares for his death (Matthew 26:6-13, Mark 14:3-9).
- N. Jesus celebrates the Passover with his disciples in Jerusalem (Matthew 26:17-30, Mark 14:12-26).

Year 4 (AD 30-33)

- O. Jesus is betrayed, arrested, and crucified by the Romans (Matthew 27:1-56, Mark 15:1-47, Luke 23:1-56).
- P. Jesus is resurrected on the third day and appears to his disciples (Matthew 28:1-20, Mark 16:1-20, Luke 24:1-53).
- Q. Jesus ascends into heaven, and the disciples receive the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:1-11).
