**order.** τάξις, *taksis*: "1 an arrangement of things in sequence, fixed succession/order... 2 a state of good order, order, proper procedure ... 1 Cor 14:40 ... Col 2:5."

**stability.** στερέωμα, *stereōma*: "1 the sky as a supporting structure, the firmament... 2 state or condition of firm commitment, firmness, steadfastness..."

elementary principles. στοιχεῖον, stoicheion: "[1] The elementary forms of religion, Jewish and polytheistic, which have been superseded by the new revelation in Christ... [2] The elemental spirits which the syncretistic religious tendencies of later antiquity associated w. the physical elements... [3] Heavenly bodies were also regarded as personal beings and given divine honors." [Stoicheion must mean something that Colossian Jews taught, and that Paul recognized as a real danger. GJC]

**fullness.**  $\pi\lambda\eta\rho\omega\mu\alpha$ , *plérōma*: "1 that which fills... makes someth. full/complete... 2 that which is full of someth... 3 that which is brought to fullness or completion... a full number... b sum total, fullness, even (super)abundance... The full measure of deity... 4 act of fulfilling specifications, fulfilling, fulfillment... 5 the state of being full, fullness of time..."

**deity.**  $\theta$ εότης, *theotés*: "The state of being god, divine character/nature, deity, divinity, used as abstract noun for  $\theta$ εός [*theos*]."

**bodily.** σωματικῶς, sōmatikōs: "Bodily, corporeally." (σωματικός, sōmatikos. "1 pert. to being corporeal as opposed to noncorporeal, bodily, corporeal... 2 pert. to the physical body, body-related, bodily.")

**certificate of debt.** χειρόγραφον, *cheirographon*: "A hand-written document, specifically a certificate of indebtedness, account, record of debts... the account that stood against us Col 2:14."

**forgive.** χαρίζομαι, *charizomai*: "1 to give freely as a favor, give graciously (a common term in honorific documents lauding officials and civic-minded pers. for their beneficence...)... 2 to cancel a sum of money that is owed, cancel... 3 to show oneself gracious by forgiving wrongdoing, forgive, pardon."

**decrees.** δόγμα, dogma: "1 a formal statement concerning rules or regulations that are to be observed... a of formalized sets of rules ordinance, decision, command... b of an imperial declaration ... decree... 2 something that is taught as an established tenet or statement of belief, doctrine, dogma."
